## Deaf Adoption Update

We just finished an adoption fundraiser for one of the families I have had the privilege of walking alongside during their adoption process from the very beginning. They are Boris and Donna Katic and they are both Deaf. They are adopting a precious Deaf boy from Russia. The *Signs for Hope* 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday Fellowship Lunch after church, this past Sunday, provided \$800 in donations to help with their adoption expenses. What an awesome way for so many of God's people to come together and experience the pure and undefiled religion that James talks about (James 1:27).

God continues to teach me that He uses each of us—His children—to accomplish His will as we collaborate together. If you have known me very long you have heard me say that God does not expect us to be "Lone Ranger" Christians, but instead desires for us to work together to accomplish greater things than what we can do alone. Collaboration is work, but it is work that God blesses. I encourage you to review what God has called you to do and ask Him how you can involve others to accomplish this task that might seem to be impossible for you to conquer alone. He often has others waiting in the wings, when we willingly acknowledge we cannot accomplish His plan without others locking arms with us in the process.



Please pray for the nine families from seven states that have contact me, seeking advice, as they progress through the process of adopting Deaf/HOH children. Some of these families have finished their paperwork and are waiting to get the call to "go" pick up their children. Some are still trying to determine God's plan for them concerning adoption and others are in varying stages of the adoption process. **Please join me in praying for their relationships to God to be strengthened as**

they seek His plan for their families and for His leading to be clearly understood. Adoption, there is nothing like it!

The Deml family is currently in Ukraine spending time with their three boys (brothers; the oldest is Deaf) waiting for incountry paperwork to be completed. Just before Christmas they were informed their boys had been chosen by a family from France and they would no longer be available. In Ukraine you are not officially "matched" with a child until you arrive. The Deml's did not allow this news to end their adoption journey, but instead decided to fly to Ukraine and trust that God knew who their children were, even if they did not. In His sovereignty, the adoption by the couple from France fell through and the three brothers were left for the Deml's to claim as theirs. 
